Habakkuk = 'one who wrestles'

What Habakkuk <u>saw</u>:

Habakkuk sees violence in his world and sees God doing nothing about it.



"Habakkuk is a unique Old Testament book. Unlike other prophets who declared God's message to the people, this prophet dialogued with God about the people. Most Old Testament prophets proclaim divine judgment. Habakkuk pleads for divine judgment. Habakkuk is perplexed if not angry at God because He is being indifferent to those who are causing suffering in Habakkuk's world." -Dr. Constable



What Habakkuk <u>saw</u>:

Habakkuk's life is going to turn out very differently than he expected.

God was going to raise up the Babylonians to discipline the people of Judah.

What God <u>Revealed</u>:

The righteous live by faith in the goodness and the sovereignty of God even when they can't understand His plan.
